SANDAG Grant Program Overview and Quarterly Status Update

Overview

The SANDAG Grant Program is responsible for developing and administering the agency's competitive grants. There are currently [nine grant programs](#)¹ that award federal, state, and TransNet funds to the region's local government agencies, transit operators, and non-profits, typically through a call for projects (CFP). Grant Program staff coordinate the CFP, including awarding and programming of funds; assisting with project initiation; monitoring project and program performance; and providing reports to appropriate advisory bodies.

In late 2025, SANDAG made organizational changes that resulted in the SANDAG Grant Program moving under the Regional Planning Department to better align grants with the Regional Plan, the Coordinated Plan, and the Environmental Mitigation Program.

Key Considerations

Realignment of Grant Program

Since moving the Grant Program under the Regional Planning Department, staff have conducted a comprehensive assessment of grants to identify areas of opportunity and address recommendations from performance audits and Peer Review Panels. This includes:

- Developing a risk management framework to proactively monitor grantees and overall contract compliance.
- Process improvements for grant applications and evaluation criteria to maintain accuracy and integrity of the grant programs. This includes automating functions to reduce manual errors and streamlining evaluation criteria.
- Evaluating and updating Standard Operating Procedures for Grant Programs.
- Evaluating strategic partnerships with foundations that could bring additional funding to grant programs.
- Evaluating different models for administering grants.
- Evaluating the Federal Transit Administration Section 5310 Program to increase efficiency, reduce risk, and better align with the 2025 Coordinated Plan

These recommendations are being incorporated into a detailed work plan, and staff will bring progress updates on work plan implementation to the Policy Advisory Committees for discussion throughout the year.
