## ARJIS Mission & Purpose

- ARJIS is a Joint Powers Authority (JPA) and data service provider for law enforcement and public safety agencies
- Formed in 1980 by 11 local San Diego law enforcement agencies and the County Sheriff's Office
- Created to share regional law enforcement data across multiple platforms for all local, state and federal agencies that address crime in our region

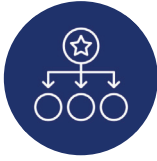

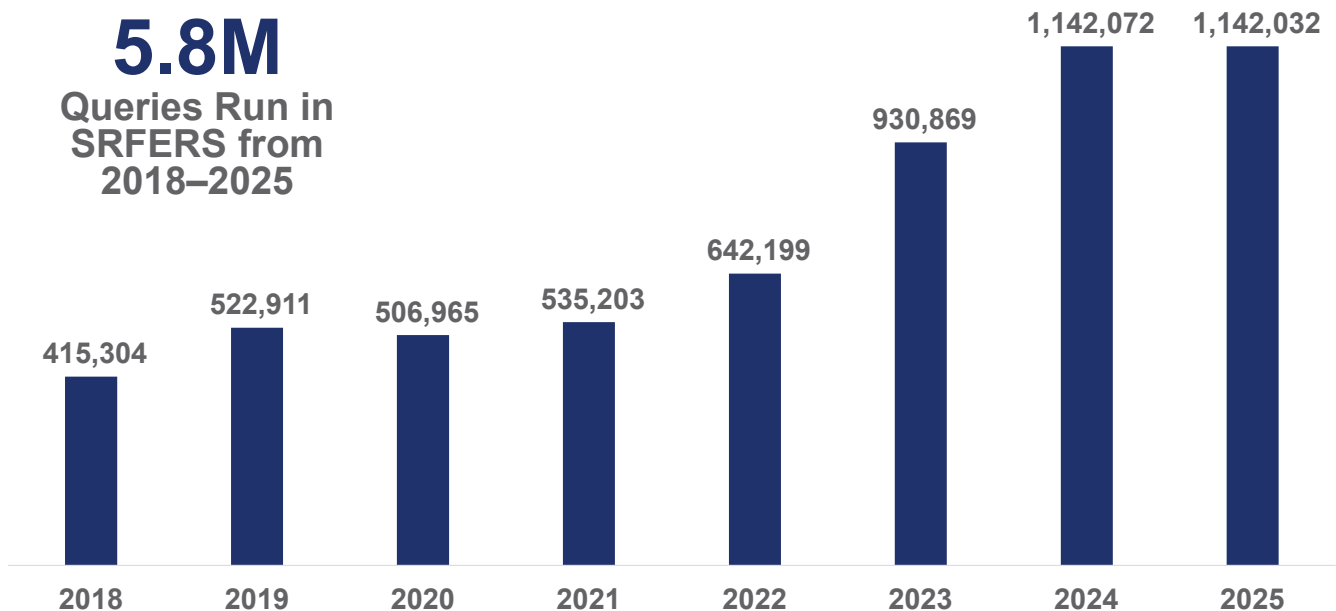

# ARJIS Data Validation

ARJIS receives and validates data from 50+ interfaces

ARJIS maintains 200 validation tables and 156,000+ fields. This ensures the region's data is standardized.

# ARJIS Crime Reporting



ARJIS manages the reporting of all regional crime statistics reporting to the California Incident Based Report System (CIBRS)



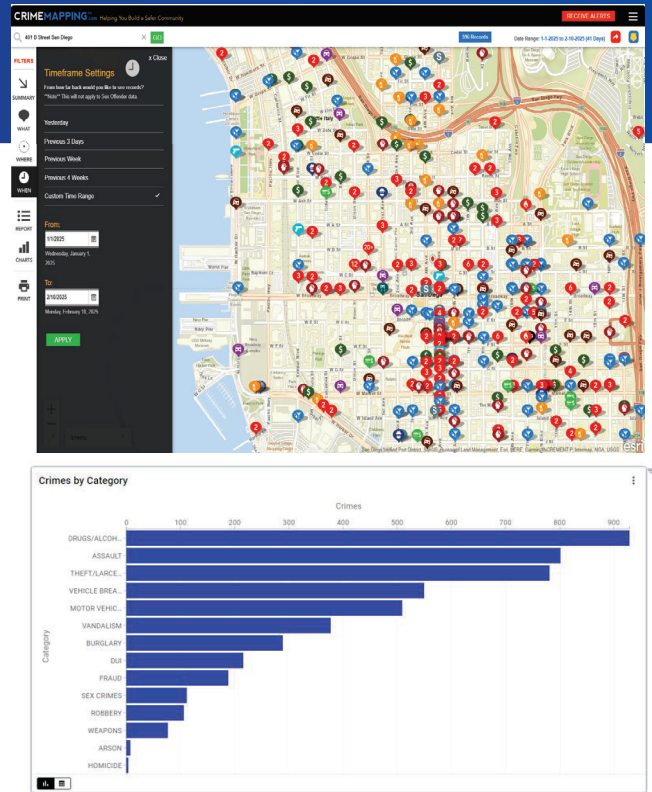
CIBRS also implemented the transition to the National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) from 2016 – 2021



ARJIS also supports mandatory reporting processes for domestic violence, regional liquor licensing, arrest and citations reporting

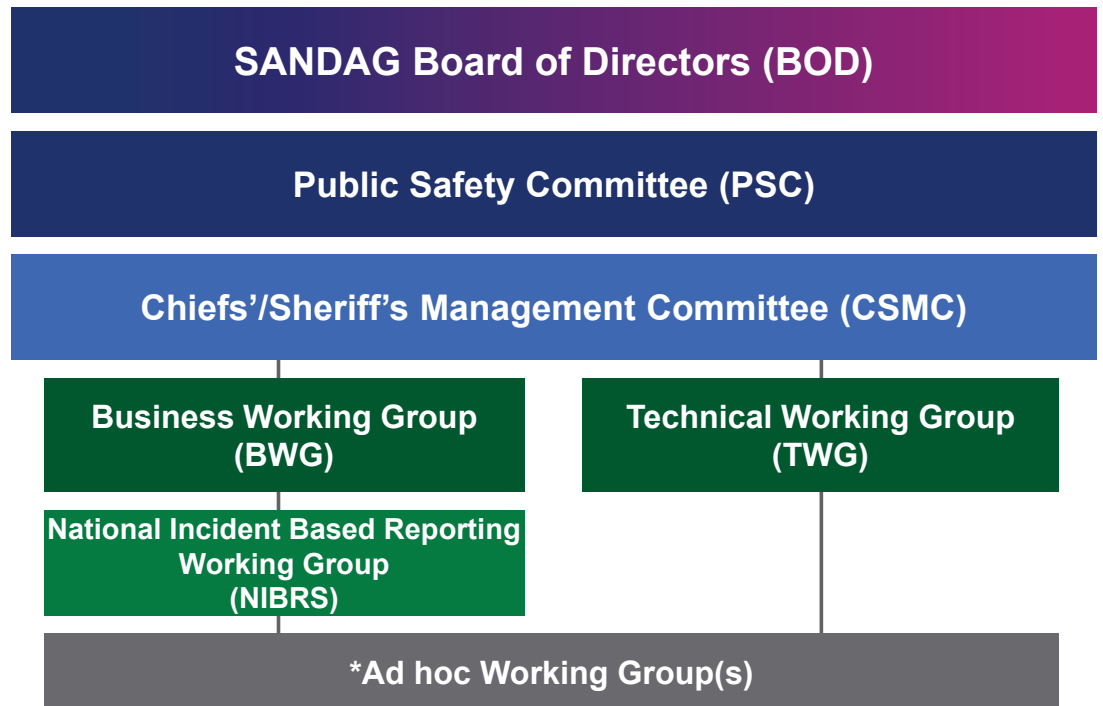

# ARJIS Funding

- ARJIS collects annual membership dues from 65 member agencies
- Fees per agency based on
  - Type of member – Charter, Participating Member or Contributing Member Agency
  - How many ARJIS users each agency

## Governing Policies

### SANDAG Governing Documents

#### 1. Board Policy No. 026—Public Safety Policy Advisory Committee

- Defines the role of the PSC in advising the SANDAG Board.
- Outlines governance, subcommittees and operational procedures.
- Details authority, including
  - approval of financial transactions up to \$500,000 and
  - oversight of ARJIS operations.

#### 2. Board Policy No. 002—Policy Advisory Committee Membership

- Explains the composition of the PSC
- Covers appointment processes, quorum requirements, and attendance expectations.
- Highlights roles of ex officio members and procedures for committee operations.

- Defines ARJIS structure
- Types of members and fee structure
- Details funds, budgeting practices, liability etc.

### 3. California Law Enforcement Telecommunications Policies, Procedures, and Protocols (CLETS PPP)

- Explains who can access CLETS data, which ARJIS contains and transmits
